Singapore Customs detains 700 counterfeit women's bags, wallets

Singapore Customs has detained 700 counterfeit women's bags and wallets that were imported from China.

During an inspection of the consignment of goods at the Tanjong Pagar Distripark, Singapore Customs officers found the 700 women's bags and wallets, suspected to be counterfeits of three popular brands.

The counterfeit goods were detained by Singapore Customs on 6 May 2015 under Section 93A(1)(a) of the Trade Marks Act. The brand owners were informed of the detention, and they can institute infringement actions against the importer under the Trade Marks Act.

Singapore does not condone such illegal trading activities and will take firm action against importers of counterfeit goods, and continue to ensure a robust intellectual property rights enforcement regime in Singapore.
