TWO MEN ARRESTED FOR EVADING OVER \$330,000 IN DUTIES AND TAXES

Singapore, 25 September 2024 – Singapore Customs (Customs) arrested two men and seized duty-unpaid cigarettes and two vans in an operation conducted at Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park on 18 September 2024.

2 During the operation, Customs officers checked two vans at the Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park carpark. They uncovered 2,958 cartons of duty-unpaid cigarettes in one van, while another 150 cartons were found in the second van parked beside it. A 44-year-old Singaporean man and a 21-year-old Malaysian man were arrested.

3 Investigations revealed that both men were allegedly engaged by an unknown person to collect and deliver the duty-unpaid cigarettes. The total duty and Goods and Services Tax (GST) evaded amounted to about \$336,820. The cigarettes and both the vans were seized. Court proceedings are ongoing.

4 Under the Customs Act and the GST Act, buying, selling, conveying, delivering, storing, keeping, possessing or dealing with duty-unpaid goods are serious offences. Offenders can be fined up to 40 times the amount of duty and GST evaded and/or jailed for up to six years. Vehicles used in committing such offences are also subject to forfeiture.
